Subject:-Issuance of Letter of permission (LoP) in respect of the application vide ref no. PRAKHAR/29/2023 dated 28.08.2023 received from the Secretary, Dr. Prakash Chandra Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bela, PO-Naubatpur, PS-Naubatpur, Dist. – Patna, Pin Code – 801109, State – Bihar for seeking permission of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine to establish a new Ayurvedic Medical college in the name of Dr. Prakash Chandra Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bela, PO-Naubatpur, PS-Naubatpur, Dist. Patna-801109, Bihar with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course, from the academic session 2024-25, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

- 1. I am to refer to your application/scheme vide ref no. PRAKHAR/29/2023 dated 28.08.2023 received from the Secretary, Dr. Prakash Chandra Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bela, PO-Naubatpur, PS-Naubatpur, Dist. Patna, Pin Code 801109 on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching and practical training for the intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2024-25, the college was visited on 18.04.2024 & 19.04.2024 on hybrid mode for issuance of the Letter of Intent (LoI) by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and the same was issued to you vide letter of even number dated 17/05/2024.
- Thereafter, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) again carried out an inspection of the institution on 27.06.2024 & 28.06.2024 through Hybrid mode to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and to verify the physical and other infrastructure facilities available for issuance of the Letter of Permission (LoP) to establish a new Ayurveda Medical college in the name of Dr. Prakash Chandra Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bela, PO-Naubatpur, PS-Naubatpur, Dist. Patna-801109, Bihar with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course course under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2024-25 and relevant regulations thereunder.

- 3. Thereafter, the assessment report and all other related documents were placed in the 99th Board Meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 26.07.2024 and the Board decided to issue letter of Permission to establish a new Ayurveda Medical college with the intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2024-25.
- 4. Further, in accordance of Section 6 (1) (i) (i) of "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019, Vide letter of even no. dated 31.07.2024 a letter was sent to you to furnish Fixed security deposit worth Rupees 01 Crore (One crore) in favour of National Commission fund for Indian System of Medicine for the period of five years. In response of the same you have furnished the fixed security deposit amount of Rupees 01 Crore (One crore) in favour of the National Commission fund for the Indian system of Medicine through RTGS vide UTR no. YESBR52024080953259191 dated 09.08.2024.
- 5. Therefore, Letter of Permission (LoP) is being issued to the Secretary, Dr. Prakash Chandra Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bela, PO-Naubatpur, PS-Naubatpur, Dist. Patna, Pin Code 801109, State Bihar to establish a new Ayurvedic Medical college in the name of Dr. Prakash Chandra Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bela, PO-Naubatpur, PS-Naubatpur, Dist. Patna-801109, Bihar with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2024-25, under Section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder subject to the following conditions: -
 - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of **60 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counselling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 8. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be submitted to MARB-ISM in order to be considered for the grant of Conditional/Permission for the academic session 2025-26:
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- 9. The College administration shall ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of the 2nd batch of student in the 1st professional of BAMS is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.

- 10. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 11. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time as per the norms which will be verified by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
- 12. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- 13. The fulfillment of the condition given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission matter for the academic session 2025-26.
- 14. Please acknowledge the receipt of this letter.
